1	Almasty, Shiremoor.  ●	Believe <b>Sponsored by The Station House, Durham</b>	6		A big IPA balancing juicy mango with a touch of wine and gooseberry.
2	Darwin, North Shields. 	Weka <b>Sponsored by Chesters, Sunderland</b>	4.5		Golden colour pale ale, hopped with generous amounts of New Zealand hops, Motueka & Nelson Sauvin. Big citrus aromas and flavours.
3	Electric Bear, Bath.	Inspector Remorse <b>Sponsored by Mid Boldon Club, East Boldon</b>	4.7		This dark brew contains heaps upon heaps of chocolate and biscuit malt in the lusciously rich mash. As this fantastically quaffable porter warms up it reveals cold brew coffee, oatly granola, and an abominable amount of chocolate biscuits.
4	Great North Eastern, Dunston. 	Chinook <b>Sponsored by The Steps, Washington</b>	4.1		Powerfully hopped very pale ale. <b>Gluten free</b>
5	Iron Pier, Gravesend. ●	Porter <b>Sponsored by The Marine South Shields</b>	5.3		This Classic Porter is complex, rich and dark. Balancing roasty malt flavours with a robust bitterness and subtle hop character.
6	Liquid Light, Nottingham.	Vacuum Boots <b>Sponsored by Sir William de Wessynton, Washington</b>	4.9		We used our usual Oat heavy malt bill and added some of our favourite yet subtle hops. With Cascade, Cashmere and Idaho 7 for a lovely floral, Peach & Mango flavour profile. This delicate refreshing pale can be enjoyed cold and fizzy or cool and low carb.
7	Manchester, Manchester.	King Cotton <b>Sponsored by The Steamboat, South Shields</b>	4.2		One of our more traditional brews - chestnut ruby in colour with loads of sweet malt and gentle dark fruit aroma from Goldings hops.
8	Maxim, Houghton Le Spring. 	John Bull Stout <b>Generously donated by Maxim Brewery</b>	5		Golding and fuggle hops combine with chocolate and black malts to give a smooth roast bitterness and light blackcurrant flavours.
9	Metalhead, Bedlington. 	Best Mate <b>Sponsored by The Queen Vic, Roker</b>	4.2		A dark ale with coffee notes and a creamy head. Fined.
10	Neptune, Liverpool.	Forecast Jester <b>Sponsored by Insangel.co.uk, Live Music Service</b>	3.9		Classic Jester hop. Giving flavours of grapefruit and blackcurrant, balanced against the biscuity malt base, this ever popular combo is just what your customers are looking for.



12	Northern Alchemy, Newcastle  	John Barleycorn <b>Sponsored by Glenda Young, Sunderland Author.</b>	4.8		Circa 1920's mild.

	Brewery	Beer	ABV	Colour	Tasting Notes
1	Electric Bear Bath.  	All the Best Names get Vetoed  <b>Sponsored by Ossett Brewery W Yorks</b>	8		Packed full of crystalized Ginger in the kettle and finished off with generous helpings of vanilla pods and cacao nibs. This beer is a well rounded belter.
2	Buxton, Derbyshire  	Quercus  <b>Sponsored by 6 Barrels North Shields</b>	5.5		A smooth and fruity, hazy style pale ale, Double Dry hopped with HBC 586 cryo hops.
3	Exale, Walthamstow, E. London 	Flowering Funk	4.4		A Passion fruit and Orange Blossom wild beer fermented with yeast harvested from local flora. More funky than super sour with a floral finish.

	Producer	Cider/Perry	ABV	Taste	Tasting Notes
1	Ascension, East Sussex.	Wrath  <b>Sponsored by Blues Micro Pub Whitburn</b>	4	Sweet	Fresh, fruity and initially sweet but with a drying finish. Red grape juice was added to a low-acid cider blend to showcase the apple/grape sweet/acid balance and was an instant hit on the farm!
2	Ascension, East Sussex.	Per ( Pyder)  <b>Sponsored by The Avenue, Roker</b>	4.8	Sweet	Our take on a 'pear cider' also known as a pyder. Wild fermented apple cider is blended with freshly pressed conference pear juice to bring a sweet,soft soft cider. Dedicated to a legend of aviation, Per Lindstrand.
3	Masham Cider Press, North Yorkshire. 	Cracker Jack	6.3	Dry	A powerful workhorse of a cider blending Shropshire and Herefordshire cider apples with Yorkshire heritage and culinary varieties. Rich in tannins with a bittersweet finish this cider certainly packs a punch.
4	Masham Cider Press, North Yorkshire. 	Green Dragon	6.1	Dry	Local apples pressed at the Exelby Green Dragon in Autumn of 2021 blended with local cider apples from Foxbridge Orchards just 1 mile away as the crow flies. Mother nature (with a little bit of help from us) creating a lively zinger of a cider to refresh the senses.
5	Olivers, Herefordshire 	Shezam	6	Medium	Wild fermented, medium blend. Less acidity than many Oliver's ciders. Bitterharp and bittersweet blend. Big fruit punch and easy tannins.
